	ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA
<u>Document</u>	Multiple disabilities means impairments occurring at the same time (such as intellectual disabilities-blindness or intellectual disabilities-orthopedic impairment), the combination of which causes such severe educational needs that they cannot be accommodated in special education programs solely for one of the impairments.

Document	In meeting the criteria for multiple disabilities, that a combination of impairments causes severe educational needs that they cannot be accomplished in special education programs solely for one of the impairments,
